

# A LEVEL RESULTS

## 55% A★ and A at Lucton School

Lucton's Year 13 students are celebrating the excellent A-level results they have received this year. A massive 55% of all A levels taken at Lucton achieved A★ or A grades. This is an excellent set of results of which many highly selective sixth forms would be proud. The majority of this year's Lucton leavers are now destined for Russell Group universities. This overall level of performance is

reminiscent of the old-fashioned selective grammar schools and is all the more impressive when you consider that Lucton has a highly inclusive admissions policy. Further statistics in the results are equally impressive, with 76% A★ to B

and 85% A★ to C grades. Moreover, it is worth adding that the vast majority of the A-levels taken in the Lucton Sixth Form are in the traditional, academically demanding, subjects favoured by world-class universities. This aspirational spirit was particularly exemplified by Head Boy Yang Xi, whose six A levels included three A★s in chemistry, maths and further maths and Laurence Thompson's A★ in maths and further As in physics and chemistry. Other notable performances

were recorded by Dhiluni Kandage (3 As and 2 Bs) and Lauren Wiseman-Jones (2 As and a B). Naturally, the ability of our students has been reflected in the offers they have received from prestigious Russell Group universities, such as UCL, Imperial College, Birmingham, Manchester and Southampton, as well as other established and respected institutions.
