100% pass in LAMDA examinations

Mrs Rogers is over the moon with the 100% pass rate for students in the latest LAMDA examinations. This is an amazing achievement, with over fifty pupils throughout the school entering and everyone passing, with a good number of merits and distinctions at all levels through the school.

During three days of examinations, 31 pupils from the Prep School and 24 from the Senior School entered in either the Acting or the Verse and Prose categories, with some entering both.

One great plus with the LAMDA examinations is that at the very top grades, when the candidates are entered for Gold, Silver or Bronze medals, there is the opportunity to achieve UCAS points, which a number of our seniors managed on this occasion. In the Verse and Prose category: Jenny Burgess, Distinction at Bronze. Edward Llewellyn, Merit at Silver, Charles Urmston, Merit at Silver, Yang Xi, Distinction at Silver, Philippa Winstone, Distinction at Gold. In the Acting category: Peter Evrard, Pass at Bronze, Steven Amos, Merit at Bronze, Emily Wynne, Merit at Bronze. These results provide valuable UCAS points, with Philippa's Distinction at Gold being worth 65 points. In comparison, an A at A Level is worth 120 points and a C is worth 80 points.
