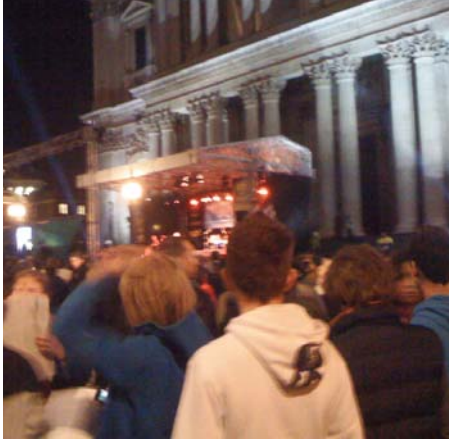


## Arts & Business on London trip
