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Battlefields Trip 2019

Students from Y9, 10 and 11 enjoyed a fantastic trip to Belgium to visit the Battlefields of the First World War, just before half term. After an early start, leaving at 5am, the students settled in well and were in high spirits as they made their way across France into Belgium. Indeed, despite delays on the Eurostar, we managed to arrive in Ypres in time to visit the Vimy Ridge Memorial and the allied trenches surrounding it. Over the next few days, the students would immerse themselves in the lives, battles and impact of the soldiers who fought in the First World War, visiting an array of battlefields and museums, including In Flanders Fields Museum, Hill 62, Sanctuary Wood, Essex Farm Hooge Crater Museum, and Tyne Cot Cemetery, amongst others! Indeed, at Tyne Cot, Toby Gilmour was able to locate a relative who fought on the western front, whilst Sam Thomas also located a relative, through research conducted at home, whose name he then found inscribed on the Menin Gate! The students were a real credit to Lucton, with Georgia Brown and Kian Hassan remembering the fallen with great respect in their CCF uniforms under the Menin Gate, during the Last Post



Ceremony. Despite it being a moving trip, we still squeezed in a little bit of downtime, with trips to a local Belgian chocolatier, who even had a 'Welcome Lucton School' sign up in the window! Overall, the students were fantastic and came away with much to talk and think about as they arrived back in a rather wet UK on Friday. Well done all involved!
